# A Vision for St. Cuthbert's Archdeaconry

# **GOD'S CALL**

God calls us to be a pilgrim people; a people who have left the known and the comfortable behind in order to follow Jesus into the Kingdom of God. Throughout the Bible, people are called by God to leave their homes, to become someone different, and to join with God to fulfil God's will and purpose. Abram and Sarai left Haran for Canaan and became Abraham and Sarah. Jacob became Israel. Moses led the people out of slavery in Egypt to freedom in the desert and towards the Promised Land. Jesus' disciples were ordinary people who left their old lives behind and followed him to the cross and the empty tomb and beyond. Simon became Peter, "the Rock." On the Damascus Road, Saul was transformed into Paul. The Kingdom of God is death to our old selves and rebirth into new life.

Today, God is calling the Anglicans of St. Cuthbert's to leave behind our comfortable and reassuring ways to take bold steps to renew the Church. It is a call that goes beyond parish and financial reorganization. God is calling us to renew our zeal for the Gospel, to bring God's Word to our communities, to put our faith into action. For the Anglican Church, it is literally a call to move from death to life.

- Model environmental stewardship and sustainability.
- Work ecumenically wherever and whenever possible.
